Local Resources



This section lists the local resources available for you in Great Torrington. It is up to you whether to make use of them. However, living with dementia can be a lonely experience and the available support can ease this a little.

Helping you with Advice and Support



The Cafe is open 10.30 am to 12.30 pm on the 2nd Thursday of each month and also on the 4th Thursday from April to September. It is held at the Methodist Church Hall on Mill Street, Great Torrington.

It operates on a drop-in basis so just turn up and you will be welcomed by the staff and volunteers with a cup of tea or coffee and a piece of cake. It offers a place where people with dementia and their families and friends can visit to support each other, share information and experiences. Trained volunteers are also on hand to answer any questions, provide support and ideas about coping strategies along with signposting to other relevant services.

The cafe offers a listening ear and a couple of hours break from the regular days' routine.

Torrington Library

The library offers help in a number of ways:

- It holds a collection of books giving information on dementia and different accounts of living with dementia
- It has a collection of DVDs and large print books
- It offers a befriending service which will take books to people's homes as part of the home library services
- The library is a safe and quiet space to visit to choose your own books. All staff are Dementia Friends.

• On Thursdays you can book a session to help with the use of iPads which will set up reminders for you for regular activities

Quieter times to visit are Tuesday and Thursday afternoons

Foodbank

The foodbank provides a basic food parcel consisting of tinned or dried food for people who need emergency help due to sickness, homelessness, benefit cuts or delays, domestic violence, for example. This service is available to residents of Great Torrington and surrounding parishes.

Bickford Centre

Perhaps some of you wonder what the Bickford Centre does? The Centre is open 6 days a week for older people to socialise and have a rest if they have been out and about in the town. It is nice and warm with comfortable chairs. In the mornings from 10.00 to 12.00 you can have a cuppa which is served by our band of volunteers. There are papers available to read too. They provide various services such as chiropody and sensory help from 'See Hear'. It is the base for the 'Get Together Friends' who arrange lunches, cinema outings to the Plough and regular beetle drives on a Sunday. In Torrington,

there is no chance of being lonely, you are most welcome for a friendly chat and a cup of tea or coffee.



TorrAGE Ageing Well

As part of the support for Ageing Well, TorrAGE provide a number of classes which promote wellbeing and good health. They are suitable for all and provide refreshments as well. A small donation is requested to help with the cost.

- Mondays: Fitness with Friends at Castle Community Centre, 2 to 3:30 pm (term time only). Suitable for all. £3.50 donation per session (including refreshments).
- <u>Wednesdays</u>: Singing for Health at Torrington Community Hospital, first & third Wednesday of the month from 10.30 am to 12.00 noon. This is a dementia friendly session but suitable for all with refreshments. £2 donation (including refreshments).

Fit as a Fiddle at Buckland Brewer Hall, from 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm (term-time only). No class on the second Wednesday of the month. Suitable for all. £3.50 donation per session (including refreshments).

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Neighbourhood Chaplains

This is a community hospital which holds many different outpatient clinics, including district nursing, community rehabilitation, social services, gynaecology, ear, nose & throat,

The hospital frequently works with people living with dementia and cognition issues and usually are the ones who complete environmental checks and signpost to other support. Referral to the hospital can be made via healthcare professionals and GPs.
